Do you want to work with children, look after children at home or in a childcare centre? This course will widen your ability to provide holistic care. You will gain the knowledge and skills required to assist with children of all ages in various environments such as at home, at work or in dedicated childcare centres.

This qualification reflects the role of educators in early childhood education and care who work in regulated children's education services in Australia. Educators at this level are responsible for designing and implementing curriculum that meets the requirements of an approved learning framework and for maintaining compliance in other areas of service operations. They use specialised knowledge and analyse and apply theoretical concepts to diverse situations. They may have responsibility for supervision of volunteers or other educators.

Early childhood educators work in long day care centres, family day care, pre-schools, or kindergartens.

To achieve this qualification, the individual must have completed a total of at least 280 hours of work in a regulated children's education and care service in Australia as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of units of competency that includes the requirement for workplace hours.

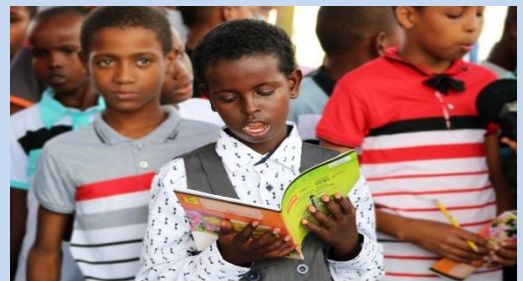
Pathways from the qualification

This qualification provides a pathway to work as a Personal Care Assistant, Family Support Worker, In House Respite Worker, and Assistant in Nursing in organisations such as Age care homes and nursing homes etc.

Entry requirements

For International students:



- Have completed Year 12 education or equivalent
- Have obtained an IELTS band score of at least 5.5 or equivalent English certification. Otherwise assessed by HIC as having the proficiency to meet the course requirements; or
- Have completed a Certificate III, Certificate IV, Diploma or Advanced Diploma level Training Package course in Australia;
- Above 18 years of age

Modes of Delivery

This program is delivered in a classroom-based environment with access to a Practical aged care lab for practical components of the course. In addition, students will also be required to undertake a practical placement in a workplace environment under supervision to ensure the student can perform the work as expressed in each unit of competency. Each unit is delivered and assessed as a standalone unit. This program also contains an e-learning component to consolidate their learning.
